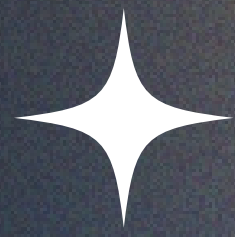
About THE WORKSHOP

Following the successful completion of the Exploitation Workshop, SC4EU partners convened to advance discussions on the strategic uptake and long-term sustainability of project results. The session provided a structured forum for the consortium to examine potential exploitation pathways, both at the individual partner level and through joint collaborative mechanisms.

Particular emphasis was placed on identifying viable routes for the deployment and scaling of Key Exploitable Results (KERs). Partners presented preliminary exploitation intentions, highlighting sector-specific opportunities, market relevance, and alignment with existing organizational capabilities. These discussions enabled the mapping of complementary strengths within the consortium, fostering synergies that support joint exploitation strategies.

In addition, the workshop facilitated a critical exchange on intellectual property considerations, business model development, and potential barriers to market entry. The consortium collectively explored pathways to maximize impact, including commercialization prospects, policy uptake, and further research and innovation activities.

The outcomes of the workshop mark a significant step toward ensuring that project results achieve sustained value beyond the project lifecycle. Partners will continue to refine their exploitation plans, reinforcing both individual commitments and collaborative approaches to delivering tangible societal and economic benefits.
